Early Childhood Programs

Our approach to early childhood education is to reinforce the child's natural curiosity for learning with the support of degreed teachers, trained staff and highly important - parent inclusion.

Kids Learning Place is focused on providing the best early care and educational environments for young children. With an emphasis on **EVERY DAY EXPLORING...** our comprehensive program encourages children to explore indoor and outdoor environments, learn by carrying out their own intentions, as well as develop and build on their own interests. **EVERY DAY LEARNING...** seeks out the curiosity and inquisitiveness of children through variety of observations and discovery experiences. **EVERY DAY GROWING...** promotes social-emotional development in a caring and nurturing environment, where learning is fun.



Services are offered through a combination of programs and options:

Early Head Start / Head Start – specialized education program for children birth to 5 years old that provides learning experiences to promote each child's readiness for school and beyond.

In addition to school readiness education, comprehensive services include health, nutrition,

and developmental screenings to ensure the children are healthy for kindergarten. Also, included is family well-being support to enable families to achieve their own goals, to strengthen parent-child relationships, and engage families. The options include:

- **full-day classrooms** (6 hours a day, 4 or 5 days a week according to the location)
- **part-day (preschool) classrooms** (3 ½ hours a day, 4 days a week)
- **home base visits** (weekly 90 minute instructional and parenting education with case management, includes monthly socialization events for children and parents)
- **pregnant women** and their families (periodic visits providing pre-natal and post-natal family support)

This program is offered at NO COST to income eligible, homeless, and foster care families. In addition, the program allocates 10% of the participant slots for children with diagnosed special needs.

Youth Programs

We believe that positive youth development will occur when there is connection, inspiration, and motivation. Through a model that supports the social-emotional needs of youth the trained staff support the youth's ability to build healthy relationships, learn in ways that work for them, and realize a higher sense of self and achievement.

Gateway Youth Program offers youth development and prevention services that specialize in working with youth ages 7 to 17. The youth are served through a variety of programs that include Community Connectors, Incredible Years, The Connection Center, and

tutoring. Youth come to us from a variety of ways and reasons; many are struggling in relationships, self-esteem, in conflict with their family, or need help to succeed in school. Gateway's main goal is to help youth gain the skills necessary to deal with life's many challenges. The program is available in Darke County.



ACES (Achievement Center for Educational Success) assists students in grades 9 through 12 in Darke, Miami and some surrounding counties. These are students that need a structured, supportive and educational environment as they work toward their high school diploma. Many students that come to the program are credit deficient or looking for an alternative learning environment in order to succeed. ACES philosophy is that all students can learn and succeed when the conditions are conducive to their needs and community efforts are available to help them overcome their obstacles.

Coursework is provided in smaller classrooms, through online classes and by independent study all under the guidance of an onsite certified teacher and aides. A workforce development program is available to qualified students who are matched to jobs in the community.
